The Professional Development Council serves as the educational governing body for the health system to determine educational needs & methods for various topics/rollouts.

> What is in it for me? Interdisciplinary collaboration on health system goal-related initiatives.


What will I do as a member of PDC? Provide oversight for DUHS education initiatives related to nursing practice, education, professional development, & more.
