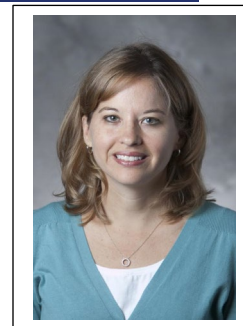
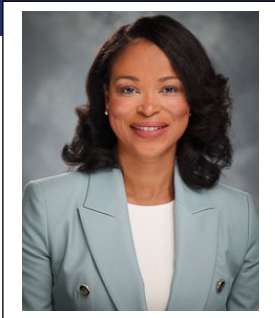

The IPEC Center is pleased to announce the 2021-2022 grant recipients. Each grant was evaluated based on its development of interprofessional learning experiences for students that address the IPEC priorities including justice, diversity, equity, inclusion, well-being, and community engagement. IPEC Center collaborates on HRSA project to offer Duke Well-being Essentials Program to promote resilience and reduce burnout in the current and future healthcare workforce.

Stress First Aid Program will focus on Health Professions Students at Duke and NCCU

The IPEC Center is collaborating with the Duke Center for Healthcare Quality and Safety, IPEC Center, DUSON Student Success Center, and North Carolina Central University on a 3 year program aim at improving the well-being of the current and future healthcare workforce. Programs include:

Well-being Webinar Series (aka WELL-B) will reach >100,000 health professionals, staff, and trainees in North Carolina and Michigan. The training is practical, engaging, and evidence-based and topics include Burnout, Work-Life Balance, Sleep, Gratitude, Mindfulness, and Dealing with Difficult Colleagues.

Stress First Aid (SFA) Training will be provided to over 1500 pre-clinical health professions students from 8 different programs at Duke and North Carolina Central University (NCCU). SFA is a peer-support program that teaches participants how to assess and respond to suspected psychological injuries to promote collective well-being and resilience.

Educational Programming

FLIP 2 Workshop Coming This Spring

The Center is sponsoring the second Foundations of Learning in Interprofessional Practice (FLIP!) Workshop of the year this spring to provide health professions students with interactive, case-based experience in interprofessional communication. Over 400 students from DPT, OTD, PA, ABSN, and MD programs will learn about a variety of strategies for collaborating across professions to provide high quality patient care. This is one of the first face-to-face events since the pandemic and the team is very excited about this opportunity.

Student Engagement

The IPEC Center selected 18 students from MD, DPT, PA, ABSN, MSN, DNP, and PhD programs to participate in the IPEC Student Advisory Committee (SAC). The committee was divided into 4 focus areas: service learning, social events, clinical experiences, and didactic/courses (aka “classroom”). This engaged group of students have been instrumental in generating ideas each workgroup has developed proposals for future student activities and involvement. The group has also provided feedback on IPEC Center initiatives, including the new FLIP! Curriculum.

SERVICE LEARNING FORUM



The Duke Health Interprofessional Education and Care Center (IPEC) Student Service Learning Committee hosted a forum for health care professions students who serve our community or just want to learn more about service learning in the IPE Building on Wednesday March 16th. Twelve students representing all health professions programs attend the hybrid event and exchanged experiences with service learning activities.
