

Since our inception in 2009, the Duke Institute for Healthcare Improvement (IHI) Open School's vision has been to coordinate, connect, and inspire interprofessional students to learn about, engage in, and lead healthcare improvement across Duke University Health System and beyond. Duke IHI unites over 500 students across Duke University's graduate and professional schools to offer opportunities for students to drive quality and innovation within their respective healthcare communities.

## **Interprofessional Development**

- 500+ students from the schools of nursing, medicine, business, public policy, engineering, and global health
- Seminar series and workshops led by health system leadership and faculty such as Chancellor Washington and Kevin Shah
  - o 40-70 attendees at each event
    - 50-60% from Medicine
    - 20-30% from Business
    - 5-10% from Nursing
    - 5-10% from other schools
