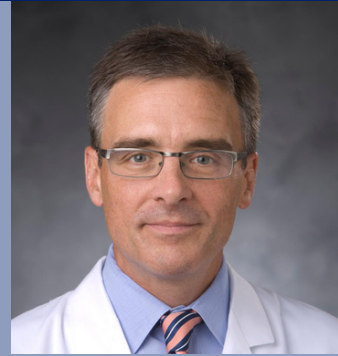

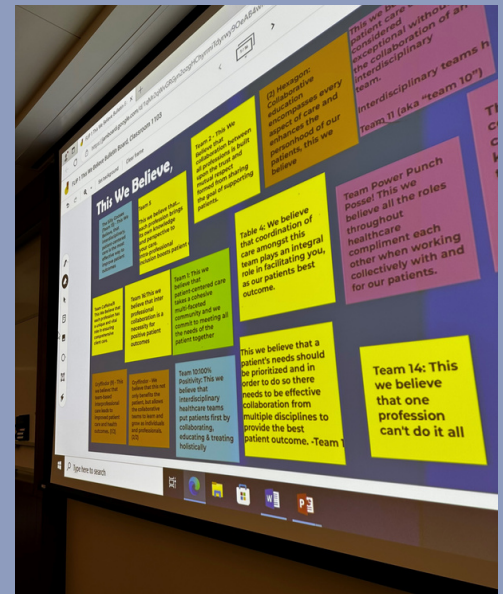

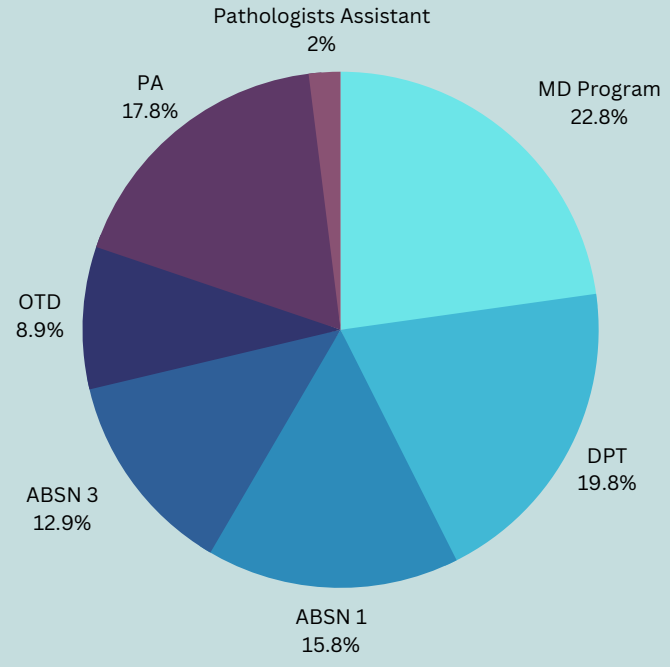
L : Student Advisory Committee at FLIP! Workshop. R: "This We Believe" statements populating on classroom boards

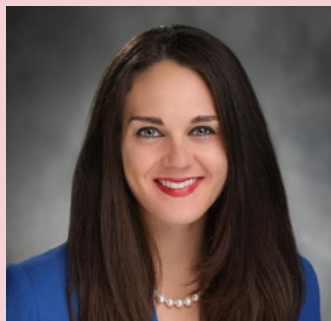
