## NURSING FACULTY OPPORTUNITY Adult Health Advanced Practice Nurse

The Duke University School of Nursing (DUSON) invites applications from doctorally-prepared candidates for a full-time faculty position with primary teaching responsibilities within the School's Accelerated Bachelors of Science and Master of Science in Nursing programs. Well-qualified candidates will be certified as an advanced practice nurse with expertise in Adult/Gerontology or Family Health, clinically experienced, demonstrate a commitment to teaching and practice, and be eligible for approval to practice as a Nurse Practitioner in North Carolina. Primary teaching responsibilities will include physical assessment, foundational skills, and adult primary care. Advanced nursing practice in an innovative interprofessional clinic may also be available to qualified candidates. Preferred candidates will be prepared to serve as a chairperson on DNP Projects and/or PhD Dissertation committees. This is an on campus position.

Candidates will have a minimum of one year of experience as an advanced practice nurse within the past five years. Background in Adult/Gerontology and/or Family Health is required. Two to three years of experience teaching at the undergraduate and/or graduate level is desirable. Candidates will also show evidence of a developing program of scholarship. Faculty appointment for this position will be made at the Assistant or Associate Professor level on Track II (a non-tenure earning practice/clinical track) depending on candidate's qualifications.

The Duke Nursing community includes nearly 90 full-time faculty members, over 120 staff members and approximately 1,000 students. The School offers four degree programs: ABSN, MSN, DNP and PhD.
