Informatics

The Duke University School of Nursing invites applications for our expanding Nursing and Health Informatics programs. Candidates with interest in serving as faculty lead for this area should be doctorally prepared and have formal training in either nursing informatics, biomedical informatics or health informatics, and demonstrate scholarly accomplishments including publications of scholarly work. Prior graduate teaching experience is required. This faculty member will be required to teach informatics courses in our Masters, Certificate, and DNP programs. The informatics program strongly collaborates with the Duke Center for Health Informatics (DCHI). The DCHI is a multidisciplinary training and research organization dedicated to educating the next generation of health informaticists, researchers, designers, implementers, and users alike. The School of Nursing is also affiliated with the Duke Health Technology Solutions as well as the Duke University Health System, which includes three area hospitals, multiple long-term care facilities, and the Duke Center for Integrative Medicine. Candidates eligible for appointment to the tenure track will have an independent program of research. Faculty appointment for this position will be made at the Assistant, Associate or Professor level on a tenure earning track or on a non-tenure earning practice/clinical track, depending on the candidate's qualifications; joint appointments are negotiable.

The Duke Nursing community includes nearly 90 full-time faculty members, over 120 staff members and approximately 1000 students. The School offers four degree programs: ABSN, MSN, DNP and PhD.
