

NURSING FACULTY OPPORTUNITY
Women's Health Advanced Practice Nurse

The Duke University School of Nursing (DUSON) invites applications from doctorally-prepared candidates for a full-time faculty position with primary teaching responsibilities within the School's Accelerated Bachelors of Science and Master of Science in Nursing programs. Well-qualified candidates will be certified as an advanced practice nurse with expertise in obstetrics, clinically experienced, demonstrate a commitment to teaching and practice, and be eligible for approval to practice as a Certified Nurse Midwife or Nurse Practitioner in North Carolina. Primary teaching responsibilities will include maternal-newborn and women's health.

Candidates will have a minimum of one year of experience as an advanced practice nurse within the past five years. Background in Women's Health is required. Two to three years of experience teaching at the undergraduate and/or graduate level is desirable. Candidates will also show evidence of a developed program of scholarship. Faculty appointment for this position will be made on Track II (a non-tenure earning practice/clinical track).

The Duke Nursing community includes nearly 90 full-time faculty members, over 120 staff members and approximately 1,000 students. The School offers four degree programs: ABSN, MSN, DNP and PhD.
